Unknown gunmen have killed the ruler of Nsit Ubium Local Government Area of **Akwa Ibom** State, Edidem Robert Obot.

Obot, a former Chairman of the Council of Chiefs, was killed in his palace in Ikot Edibon on Sunday.

The Chairman of the highest Ibibio traditional council, the **Akwa** Esop Imaisong Ibibio, Ntisong Udo Ekidem, summoned an emergency meeting of Ibibio monarchs yesterday to deliberate over the matter.

He said the deceased would be remembered for his outspokenness and his commitment to the development of **Akwa Ibom** and Nigeria.

"We will miss him. He was very outspoken and committed to the development of **Akwa** Ibom and Nigeria," he said.

Ekidem alleged that the deceased was in a tussle with the ruler of Onna Local Government Area, **Akwa** Edidem Akpabio Udo Ukpa, for the vacant stool of Oku **Ibom** Ibibio (111).

He said Governor Godswill Akpabio advised the monarchs to select the right person for the throne and he was to be named this week.

He said the Council would liaise with the family to ascertain the circumstances surrounding his death.

Police spokesman Onyeka Orji said the police are on top of the matter.

According to him, the police would stop at nothing to bring the perpetrators to book.
