A 60-year old woman and her 30-year-old **daughter** have been **raped** and **killed** in Effurun, Uvwie Local Government of **Delta** State.

Residents of PTI Road, Effurun, woke up on Wednesday to behold the act.

A son of the deceased, Aghoghor Ewenode, said his mother and sister were **raped** by the gang and shot in their lower abdomen.

Ewenode and his brother, Fejiro, stormed the Nigeria Union of Journalists (NUJ) Press Centre, Warri, alleging that they were politically motivated.

Ewenode, who claimed to be a member of the Democratic People's Party (DPP), said he had received death threats before the Tuesday night incident.

He said his sister and mother were shot in anger, after the hoodlums were told that he was not around.

The killings may not be unconnected with the shooting of some persons around Bright Street earlier that day, it was learnt.

It was gathered that a resident, simply identified as Oris, was shot by an opposing gang.

Ewonode, who was crying, said: "They (political opponents) had me beaten up in February. I was injured. It was the police who rescued me then.

"Because of the threats, I left my mother's house in Effurun for Warri.

"Even after that, they called me to say that I should remember that my people are still in Effurun that if they can't get me, they will wipe out my family.

"On Tuesday, at about 11pm, they came and **killed** my lovely mother. They shot my sister after raping her."

He accused policemen from Ekpan Division of complicity in the killings, saying his sister had reported to the police severally about threats to her life and her mother's.

Police spokesman Charles Muka said the police were aware of the report, even though the family was yet to report the

killings. He said investigation had begun.
