Two die in Abuja-Kaduna road crash

TWO persons were burnt to death in an auto crash at Dikko junction in Niger on Abuja-Kaduna dual carriage way, the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) reports.

NAN learnt that the accident involving a Peugeot J5 bus loaded with oranges and a broken down trailer occurred at about 3 a.m.

It was also learnt that the driver of the bus and a passenger were burnt to death due to poor emergency response efforts, as only a few security guards of a nearby market were available to put off the fire.

Officials of the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) were seen at about 8 a.m. removing the corpses to the Suleja General Hospital and the wreckage of the vehicles.

The FRSC Sector Command in Niger, Mr Tuma Dalok, confirmed the accident and said that the corpses had been deposited at the mogue and efforts were being made to contact their families.
