Two still missing two days after canoe accident

IWO people are still missing two days after the canoe in which they were travelling capsized on Christmas day in Tohon, a community in Badary Local Government, Lagos State.

The missing two, an aged woman who had her grandchild strapped to her back, and a young man, were with two other people in the canoe when it capsized in the middle of the river around 9pm.

They were said to be fravelling from Tohon to Vewhe, Ipokia in Ogun State to attend

a naming ceremony.

The man, who paddled the canoe, identified as Peter and a female passenger survived. Efforts by local divers led to the recovery of the body of he child early on Wednes

It was learnt that Peter, who is currently being detained at the Badagry Police Station, was reluctant in going on the journey.

He was said to have expressed fear over his ability to navigate the water that was covered by weeds.

It was learnt that two officials of the Marine Police were at the Tohon jetty be-tween 12 noon and 1pm on Wednesday.

Eyewitness told The Nation that though they had come to help search for the missing passengers, they left moments later, complaining that their operation would be hindered by the weeds on the

water. A police officer, who pleaded for anonymity, confirmed Peter's arrest and detention. He said he was being held, pending the completion of investigation.
