# 19 missing in fresh Kogi, Anambra border clash

No fewer than 19 people were missing in the latest clash between Aguleri, in Anambra East Local Government Area of Anambra State and Echonwa in Kogi State.

A total of 22 buildings were also burnt in the Okpeze community in two nights of tussle over the ownership of oil wells on the boundary of the two states.

Okpeze residents said yesterday that heavily armed invaders swooped on them on Wednesday and Thursday nights, shooting indiscriminately.

The invaders, according to the residents, then proceeded to set some of their houses ablaze.

As the occupants of the houses made to flee, the invaders pounced on them and took them to yet

One Mrs. Martha Nweke said her husband was among those taken away by the invaders.

Amidst sobs, she said: "We were asleep when suddenly we heard gunshots from different directions.

"Confusion ensued as many people ran out of their homes into the bush half naked. Children cried as the invaders dragged their fathers away.

"Those who escaped slept in the bush and, in the morning, we discovered that many houses were either burnt or looted.

"I thought my husband ran into the bush with others, but when he did not appear in the morning, we knew that he was among those that were kidnapped.

"We are worried because these invaders had boasted in the past that they would continue to kill and eat our people.

"We want our state governor, Mr. Peter Obi, and the Federal Government to step into this matter without further delay to save us from this trauma.


"We are just beginning to settle down after last year's floods destroyed our homes and crops, but here we are again facing this attempt to sack us from our community by Kogi people because oil was discovered in our land."






