**T**WO were persons, including a three-year-old baby, died while twelve others suffered serious injuries yesterday when a commercial bus conveying them tumbled into the bush in Ogun State.

The 14-seater bus, Mazda marked Lagos XW 274 EPE, which loaded Ijebu - Ode bound passengers had taken off at Kuto garage, Abeokuta, before somersaulting into the

bush by 5:30pm at Onipepeye stretch of the Abeokuta - Siun-Sagamu expressway.

The three-year-old baby girl and a grown-up man died on the spot the injured were rushed to the State Hospital, Ijaiye where doctors are battling to save their lives.

The First Lady, **Mrs. Olufunso Amosun**, who was returning from Lagos, arrived the accident scene few minutes

after it occurred.

She joined her entourage and operative of the state's traffic management agency (TRACE) to rescue and evacuate the victims to the hospital and ensure they were attended to.

The Public Relations Officer of TRACE, **Mr. Akinbiyi Babatunde**, who confirmed the accident to The Nation, blamed it on the "recklessness and over-speeding" on the part of the driver.
