Five die in road crash

TIVE persons died yesterday in an accident near Okpu Umubo Bridge, Osisioma, Aba in Abia State. A water tanker rammed into a Volkswagen Wagon belonging to Abia Line Network with registration number and a tricycle, killing three people on the spot.

It was gathered that two persons died later in an undisclosed hospital where they were taken to. The whereabouts

of the lorry driver is unknown.

An eyewitness, Kingsley Ndukwe, said: "I was washing the L300 (registration number, Abuja GWA 517 XC) bus when I heard a loud bang. I saw a water tanker coming towards me. I jumped into the river as there was nothing else I could do and that was how I escaped.

"I thank God that the tanker did not come in my direction. If it had happened that way, I wonder what would have been

my fate by now."

Ndukwe said three passengers inside the tricycle died before rescuers came. A source said: "The tanker was just handed over to a new

driver two days ago. I know the former driver. He used to come to this river to draw water with this truck.

"The last day he came here, he told us that he had been

driving this truck without brake for some time.

"He told us that while descending the hill from Okpu Umuobo junction, he used gear one until he got to this place to draw water and go back.

"This driver is a new person. It's like he did not know that the vehicle has faulty brakes. Vehicle Inspection Officers should be alive to their responsibilities."
