In one incident last Wednes-  
day, three persons were feared  
killed at Tse Tatswa Village,  
Donga. Some houses were set  
ablaze.

The name of one of the casu-  
alties was given as Tyonenge  
Kpuugh. He was said to have  
been macheted to death by his  
assailants.

A mad man, who was sit-  
ting under a tree close to the scene  
was also allegedly gunned  
down. Residents said that the  
invaders struck at about 8 o'clock  
in the morning.

Many of the villagers took  
to their heels and are now tak-  
ing refuge at Peva, in Takum.

The Shitile/Ugondo skir-  
mishes started last December  
and each side is said to be main-  
taining a standing militia for  
protection.

Many settlements from  
Ugondo and Shitile have been  
reduced to ashes, including Tse  
Gigigh, Aga, Tse Tor, Anaa,  
Atogbenda and Tse Tatswa,
