## Corps member killed in Calabar

A corps member has been killed in a clash between Adadama community in Abi Local Government Area of Cross River State and its Amagu neighbours in Ikwo Local Government Area of Ebonyi State.

The victim, identified as Ename, was the daughter of a traditional ruler in Adadama.

A commercial motorcyclist was also killed; an unidentified woman, who was shot, is in the hospital.

The communities have been bickering over boundary marks.

An eyewitness said Ename was visiting her parents and was on her way to her place of primary assignment when she was killed.

"She was on her way to Itigidi in Abi Local Government on a commercial motorcycle when men suspected to be from Ikwo accosted her. The motorcycle was carrying another woman-passenger.

"The motorcyclist was killed on the spot. Ename's head was cut off as a trophy. The other lady was left for

A source said a man from Adadama community tipped off the Ikwo people about the chief's daughter, hence they were able to track her down.

The source said: "I would not give you the name of the man, but he confessed that he was the one who called the Ikwo warriors to stop the girl on the Adadama-Itigidi Road.

"Someone from there called and told us what this man had done and when he was approached, he said he was paid to do it.

"His phone was checked and text messages of all the transactions were there. There was a bank alert for the money paid to him."
