heavy downpour, which lasted for about five hours has drowned at least six

the early hours of Friday, also caused the collapse of an uncompleted 4-storey building in the Owelle Aja area of the community, while many houses have been flooded with their occupants

most residents were hurriedly trying to salvage their property, while others were busy laying sandbags and constructing drainage.

It was also observed that a lot of people in the Oduke Layout

were wailing, where a family of four drown during the downpour.

Speaking, a landlord in the community, Chief Achebe Ifemaje, said that government must move fast to re-plan the community and stop land speculators selling every piece of available land, without minding the water channel.

What has happened is a big

lesson to everyone, especially where people refuse to plan but put money first, rather than the safety of lives.

We appeal to Gov. Willie

Obiano to come and re-plan the entire Obosi community, especially its layouts and the Owelle Aja area," he said.
