Police arrest four for 'killing' toddler

THE police in Osun State have arrested three suspected members of a fundamental Islamic sect for allegedly killing a two-year-old boy, Teslim Bakare, in Iragbiji, Boripe Local Government Area.

Moshood Aremu was said to have founded the sect, which has a mosque at Oke Mori in Iragbiji.

Led by Aremu, Tajudeen Ganiyu and Wasiu Danku allegedly kidnapped the boy at Agbelekale Compound and slit his throat.

The suspects also allegedly removed the victim's head and collected his blood in a bucket.

They were said to have been "caught" by an unidentified person, who recorded the scene on his mobile phone.

Residents said they had been suspicious of the sect members.

A police source said the suspects are at the State Criminal Investigation Department in Osogbo.

Ambode for memorial lecture

LAGOS State Governor Akinwunmi Ambode; former Supreme Court Justice George Adesola Oguntade, former President, Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), Wole Olanipekun (SAN) and NBA President Augustine Alegeh (SAN) are expected at the first Justice Afolabi Leigh Balogun memorial lecture on October 29.

The event will take place at the Banquet Hall, Nigerian Law School, Victoria Island, Lagos at 9.30am.

Justice Balogun (OFR) was a member of the 1979 Constitution Drafting Committee (CDC) and a judge of the Lagos High Court.

The Chairman, Organising Committee, Yemi Peters, gave the title of the lecture as "Law as an instrument of Social Change".

Spokesman for
