HE owner of a popular bakery on the Cham-ley Road in Calabar, the Cross River State, who was abducted two weeks ago, Mr Kenneth Anya, has died, it was learnt yesterday.

Anya, an Igbo businessman, reportedly died on Monday at his home after he was re-

leased.

His abductors were said to have demanded N10 million ransom to release him.

The cause of his death could not be established last night, but it is believed to be connected with the trauma he went through in the hands of his abductors in the last few weeks.

Last week, the Igbo community in the state, complained about the rise in kidnappings,

especially against its people. Also, Igbo businessmen have threatened to close their

businesses for two days.
