## Driver charged with killing woman, two daughters

**T**HE police have charged a driver, Sola Omoroga, with causing the death of a woman, Mrs. Toyin Adeleke, 35, and her two daughters, Deborah, 2, and one-month-old Dasola, during an auto crash in Meiran, Lagos.

The deceased, who resided on 35, Adebari Street, Meiran, were passengers onboard the suspect's bus.

Omoroga was arraigned yes-

terday before Senior Magistrate Y. R. Pinheiro (Mrs) of an Ikeja Magistrates' Court, Lagos.

He was also accused of causing serious injuries to another passenger, Okechukwu Udodi, during the accident.

Prosecuting Inspector Augustine Azamegbe said the accident happened last Tuesday, at Amose Bus Stop

along Meiran Road.

He alleged that the defendant drove a Volkswagen bus with Reg. No KJA 300 XD recklessly and dangerously on a public highway.

"The accident happened as a result of the reckless and dangerous driving of the defendant without regard to other road users and passenger which claimed lives of Mrs Toyin Adeleke, Deborah Adeleke and Dasola Adeleke,"

Azamegbe said.

The offences, he added, contravene Section 18 of the Road Traffic Law of Lagos State, 2012.

The defendant pleaded not guilty.

Magistrate Pinheiro granted him N500,000 bail with two sureties who must produce evidence of tax payment to the Lagos State Government.

The case was adjourned till October 18.
