Woman stabs brother-in-law to death in Ogun

OPERATIVES of Ogun Police Command yesterday arrested a woman, Faith Umeh, for the alleged murder of her brother-in-law, Chika Umeh.

She was apprehended by men of Ajuwon Police Station shortly after

the incident.

Faith had allegedly stabbed Chika during a scuffle which made him to slump and die in a pool of his blood.

The incident which happened at No 8, Abdullahi Oremeji Street, in the Ajuwon area of Ifo Local

Government Area of the state attracted neighbours who reported the case to police.

It was gathered that the duo launched into an altercation which led to a scuffle following which the suspect picked a kitchen knife and stabbed Chika to death.

When *the Nation* visited the area, a cross section of residents who were discussing the incident in low tone declined to speak with our correspondent.

However, a source who asked not to be named told *The Nation* that Faith and Chika had been having quarrels for unknown reasons lately.

"Although they have been quarrelling with each other for sometime but the reasons for their quarrels are not known to neighbours, because they usually tackle themselves in their local language. However, I guess the woman was not comfortable with the boy's (Chika) presence in her matrimonial home."

Although the spokesman of Ogun State Police Command, Mr Abimbola Oyeyemi could not confirm the story at press time, an impeccable police source however said the suspect was still being held at the Ajuwon Police Division.

"The story is true. It's a case of homicide and the female suspect is still being held in our division at Ajuwon pending her transfer to the homicide section at the state police command in Abeokuta."
