Information about the incident was sketchy, as at the time of filing this report.

Another source at the Aba abattoir said: "I was not there when it happened. But we were told that the deceased together with a colleague, was going to the bank to deposit money after the day's sales in one of the banks around Bata junction when they were attacked by the armed men.

"I was that they told collected the money which we later learnt was about N5m. People around the area told us that the gunmen trailed them from the abattoir to

the bank.

"Their intention was to collect the money, but one of the gunmen, who feared that he could be exposed by the victim after they had eye contact, was said to have come down from the commercial tricycle to shoot him on the forehead before they drove off."

The source said that the victim was however confirmed dead at a hospital where he was immediately rushed to for medical atten-

tion.

As at the time of filing this report, the State Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Geoffrey Ogbonna, could not answer several calls to his phone and was yet to respond to a text message sent to his phone by our reporter.

A police source in Aba confirmed the incident, saying that they were investi-

gating the matter.
