'Herdsmen have killed 24 persons in Ogun since 2000'

USPECTED Fulani herdsmen have killed 24 persons, injured scores of others and destroyed crops estimated at millions of naira in series of attacks on 13 communities in Ogun State between 2000 and December 20, 2017, it has been learnt.

The affected victims, including a husband and wife, hailed from 13 communities of Asa, Agbon-Ojodu, Igbonla, Korole, Ibeku, Moro, Koomi, Ibore, Igan-Alade, Kodera, Owode-Ketu, Adesina Village and Orisade - all in Ketu Local Council Development Area

(ICDA) of Ogun State.
Community leaders, under the auspices of Ketu Advancement Forum (KAF) and Ketu Community Development Council (KCDC), gave the figures in letters, dated December 20, 2017, by their spokesmen, Michael Ábiose and Williams Olayode, to the commissioner of police on behalf of the affected communities.

KAF and KCDC urged the police chief to ensure speedy and diligent investigation into the killings and the prosecution of suspected herdsmen for an attempted murder at Oja-Odan last December.

They said the call became necessary because dozens of their people had been killed while the herdsmen had sustained their deadly attacks.

Both groups said they were horrified by murder of Mr. Olatunji Tangu Afolabi by suspected Fulani herdsmen at Orisada village on December 19.

Atolabi's killers were said to have also burnt his body.

The groups said: "We write to commend the Nigeria Police Force (NPF) in Ogun State on its recent breakthrough of arresting three herdsmen for attempted murder and unlawful possession of firearms in our community, as reported on page 5, page 7 and page 40 of The Punch, New Telegraph and *The Nation* of Thursday, December 14, 2017, copies of which are hereby attached.

"The suspects, according to the police, are: Mohammed Bello (40), Muhammed Mohmoh (30) and Yisau Umoru (18). The action of the command was not only a welcome development to us but also a testimony to your unwavering commitment to the security of lives and property in our communities, which have come under consistent attacks by the herdsmen for over a decade.

"However, it has become pertinent and expedient for us to call for speedy and diligent prosecution of the arrested suspects in view of the dog-gedness of the herdsmen to sustain their act.

"You may wish to note that on Tuesday, December 19, 2017, and just two days after the weekend attack, the herdsmen again attacked and gruesomely murdered Mr. Olatunji Tangu Afolabi at Orisada.

They did not only murder him but also set his body ablaze. The incident was reported at the Igan-Alade Po-

"May we refresh your memory to the fact that Ketu LCDA unarguably remains the "theatre of herdsmen's yearly killings" in Ogun State. The arrival of the herdsmen in our communities at the dawn of every dry season often heralds the paralysis of economic and so cial lives.

"It may also interest you to note that 24 people had been killed by the herdsmen between 2000 and 2017

It is important to let you know that we have always been collaborating with necessary stakeholders towards addressing the menace of the herdsmen's attacks on our communities.

"The efforts included the following:

Engagement with security agencies through "Save Our Souls (SOS)" letters and meetings;

ii. Letters to the Executive and Legislative arms of government;

iii. Active participation in all public hearings by the Ogun State House of Assembly towards finding lasting solution to the menace.

"Active participation in the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) midwifed by the state government involving relevant agencies of the state, Ketu people, the herdsmen and All Farmers Association of Nigeria, among others.
"Regrettably, however; all

the above efforts have been frustrated by the unabated onslaught on our people by the

herdsmen.

"It is in view of the above that your recent breakthrough attracts our attention and resolve to work with you to ensure diligent prosecution of the arrested suspects."

Police spokesman Abimbola Oyeyemi, an Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP), told The Nation that the suspects would be investigated and prosecuted.

Oyeyemi said the police do not need to be told or prodded

to carry out their duty.

He added: "It is our duty to do the job. They don't have to write a petition or beg us to investigate and prosecute criminals. It is our duty. We have, in respect of the suspected herdsmen, arrested some sus-pects for attempted murder."
