## Woman, 90, slumps to death in Ogun

**A** NONAGENARIAN, Madam Bintu Jinadu, of Lajiga family in Makun-Sagamu, Ogun State, has allegedly slumped and died, following a raid on her home by suspected operatives of the Federal Special Anti-Robbery Squad (F-SARS) from Abuja.

The death caused protest, as women and men stormed the palace of the Ewusi of Makun, Sagamu, Oba Timothy Akinsanya, last Saturday, alleging that Bintu died of shock shortly

after suspected operatives of the F-SARS from Abuja stormed her home and whisked her son, Abdul Rahman Abdul Kabir, away on the orders of a suspected land grabber.

The nonagenarian was said to have slumped in shock after watching the brutal manner her son was whisked away. She died later.

Two men, Chief Idowu Sanya and Dauda Owolabi, were also taken away.

The protesters carried placards, such as: "Amosun Save Us from land grabbers," "We Say No to Land Grabbing", "Killing a 90-Year Old Mother is a Sacrilege", "Land Grabbers Are Terrorists, Save Us From Them."

The demonstration, which started from Awolowo Market, Sagamu, ended at the palace of Oba Akinsanya.

The protesters' leader, Jamiu Lajiga, who addressed reporters, said: "Makun - Sagamu people are tired of

the nefarious activities of land grabbers."

He alleged: "Many of the notorious land grabbers evicted from Lagos State have relocated to Remo towns and villages, terrorising and dispossessing us of our land."

Oba Akinsanya sympathised with the victims of what he called "an abominable brutalisation of innocent land owners by land grabbers."

He advised the protesters to remain peaceful and return to their homes, promising to take up the issue.
