The Nation learnt that the incident occurred on Wednesday evening. The victim, Samuel Ajayi, the only child of his parents, was said to have been trailed to a canteen in the school and shot in the neck as he was stepping out of the canteen.

Ajayi was the fifth person to be killed on Wednesday in a resumed clash between

to be killed, on Wednesday in a resumed clash between mentbers of Aye and Eiye cults at Oworonshoki, Akoka and their environs. It was gathered that his killers, suspected to be members of a rival cult, had stormed the school during students' final sign-out, announcing their presence with sporadic gunshots. The assailants, it was gathered, left shortly after the gunshots, only to return later for Ajayi said to have gone to the canteen to eat. It was learnt that policemen were later invited and they removed his body. His parents, it was gathered, ran to the school when the news of the incident reached them.

Badagry residents have accused policemen of causing the death of a 21-year-old man, Kenneth Ogbonna.

It was alleged that policemen from Badagry Division had gone to the joint for a raid, which made people to flee.

The residents, who protested on Wednesday, alleged that it was during the confusion that Ogbonna fell into the water and policemen prevented divers, who wanted to rescue him, from doing so.

Ogbonna was sald to have been left to drown and his body was yet to be

body was yet to be recovered as at Wednesday night, a development that angered members of the community.
