My ordeal in kidnappers' den, by pupil

14-YEAR-OLDboy Felix Adekunle, who hawks slippers in Owo, Ondo State, has narrated how he escaped from his kidnappers.

He spoke at the Akure office of the Ondo State Security Network codenamed Amotekun.

Adekunle, a JSS 2 student of Furaben International College, Owo, said he was walking in an isolated area of Okemapo area of Owo when he was snatched on Monday by three men.

"They dragged me into their vehicle and I became unconscious. Later I found myself in a house inside a forest. I saw a woman crying with her hands tied backwards sitting by a headless body that looked like a young person.

"I asked her who was the person and she responded that it was her child. At this period, I was hearing the men's voices inside the house. The woman told me to remove the rope she was tied up with and we fled together.

"While fleeing, the woman fell. She called me back and gave me 500 naira and said I should keep running and never look back. I heard gun shots from the house and it made me to run as fast as I could.

"When I came out of the bush, I saw some people selling bread by the roadside and narrated my ordeal to them. They called the police who did not respond and later got the *Amotekun* who responded swiftly and took me to their office.
