Apart from Akunyili, his driver and police escort, five other persons were killed in the area by gunmen. A senior police officer, who pleaded anonymity, told The Nation that the victims were killed at different locations. The source said-one person was killed at Agult, five at Nikpor and two at Obosil. The Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB) denied involvement in the killing. Its Media and Publicity Secretary, Emma Powerful, said the killing was among the political assassinations going on in the state.

"We have no hands in the political killings going on in Biafra land. We have severally raised the alarm that some cruel politicians are hiding under the cloak of the situation in Biafra land to eliminate their political enemies and blame it on IPOB.

"This is pure political assassination roing on in Anamhra State now and

"This is pure political assassination going on in Anambra State now and his been perfected by Nigeria DSS security agents are doing this to paint IPOB back in the face of support and encouragement we are getting from our people."

It was learnt that his killers might have mistaken him for a politician when they ambushed his vehicle and opened fire on the trio.

The deceased had gone to Onitsha for a lecture in honour of his late wife at Sharon Hall, All Saints Cathedral, Onitsha, which was organised by the University of Nigeria, Nsukka Alumni Association (UNAA).

At the event, a source, who also attended, said Dr. Akunyili was there with his son, Obum, a state government official.

He wrote: "I was with this man same yesterday at Sharon Hall, All Saints Cathedral, Onitsha.
