Many killed, houses razed in Akwa Ibom clash

CLASH between the Ibeno and Ilaje in Akwa Ibom State has left many dead and houses razed. Our correspondent learnt the incident erupted yester-

day after weeks of ethnic tension.

Properties worth millions were destroyed.

A community source said both sides suffered casualties but

he could not confirm the death toll

Sources said the fight started as a cult clash before it took an ethnic dimension. The Ilaje (Yoruba) people have reportedly started fleeing the community, while their houses and tents were being looted and destroyed by hoodlums.

Police spokesman Odiko Macdon said he was not aware of

the crisis, promising to find out.

He said, "I am not aware of it but I will find out."

A lawyer, Oluwajuwon Ogunbiyi, who confirmed the incident, described it as unfortunate and called on the state govern-

ment to set up a committee to investigate the crisis.

"It is quite unfortunate that this crisis has led to the loss of innocent lives and destruction of properties. The Ibeno community had been a good host over the decades and non-indigenes

have been living there in harmony without rancour.

"I'm using this medium to appeal for peace and an end to hostilities from both warring parties. I also want to call on the Governor of Akwa Ibom State as well as heads of all security agencies in the state to intervene in the matter immediately in order to stem down this waves of violence.

"The state government must as a matter of urgency set up a committee to look into this crisis so as to ascertain the major cause. Perpetrators fanning the embers of war on both sides

must be arrested immediately," he said.
