Nasarawa Police arrest lady for stabbing boyfriend to death

The police in Nasarawa State said they have arrested one Alice Mulak of Ungwan Gwari, Karu Local Government Area of the state for stabbing her boyfriend to death with a knife.

The police in a statement signed by the Public Relations Officer, Ramhan Nansel, a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP), said the lady was in their custody and further investigation was ongoing.

The statement reads: "Police operatives attached to Mararaba 'A' Division in Nasarawa State led by CSP Musa Babayola, have arrested one

Alice Mulak 'F' of Ungwan Gwari, Karu LGA for stabbing her boyfriend to death with a Knife.

"Preliminary investigation revealed that the incident happened behind City Rock Hotel, Mararaba at about 0330hrs when the deceased and his girlfriend engaged themselves in fisticuffs as a result of a misunderstanding.

"Hence, the suspect was arrested and the knife used in perpetrating the offence was consequently recovered based on the directives of the Commissioner of Police, CP Adesina Soyemi."

The command said the suspect had been transferred to State Criminal Investigation Department, Lafia for further investigation and subsequent prosecution.

Man kills wife in Ondo over N10m deposit

A 42-year-old man identified as Kelechukwu Onuka has reportedly killed his wife, Nnena, after a quarrel over N10 million deposited in her account.

This incident occurred at Aratunsi area of Akure, Ondo State capital.

Sources said the money was deposited in the wife's account by her sister for a building project.

It was gathered that the deceased husband got wind of the money in her wife's account through another person.

Apparently peeved by his wife's action, the suspect reportedly confronted her and it resulted in a quarrel.

It was during the fracas that the suspect allegedly used an object to hit his wife on the head and she died instantly.

A neighbour said they called in the police after the husband called them to help carry his wife to the hospital.

Another neighbor, who gave his name as Obinna, said the couple were always having arguments but they used to settled issues between themselves.

"There was even a day that after beating her, the man called us to assist him to take his wife to the hospital.

"I really don't know what led to this fight that caused the death of the woman.

"But on this day, it became serious. We were hearing their voices and later everywhere went silent.

"Before we knew what went wrong, the man was trying to revive the lady after using something to strike her in anger."

Ondo State Police spokesman, SP Fummy Odunayo, said it was a case of domestic violence.

seven suspected traffic robbers in Lagos

Command in Lagos State says seven suspected traffic robbers it alleged have been arrested on Ketu-Ikorodu Expressway.

The spokesman, SP Benjamin Okeke, said the arrest yesterday in his command area was monitored by the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN).

Five of the suspects were arrested at 11.00 a.m. while they were attacking a motorist at Kosofe Food Market.

"On Thursday, five traffic robbers swooped on a motorist at Kosofe Bus Stop, along Ikorodu Road.

"The Ketu Police Division's patrol team arrested them all, and that action led to the arrest of two others," he said.

The spokesman said that the suspects' age ranged between 18 and 28.

He said that investigation was ongoing at the divisional level on the arrested suspects.

NAN reports that the command arrested 35 suspected armed robbers between June and August, 2022.
