Troops hit bandits in Kaduna camp raid

30 terror suspects killed, 70 arrested in Northeast
We'll be back on Oct. 30, gunmen tell community

ROOPS of Operation
Whirl Punch have taken out an unspecified
number of bandits at a location off Kaduna-Abuja Expressway.

Kaduna State Commissioner for Internal Security and Home Affairs, Samuel Aruwan, said in a statement yesterday that troops moved in on the terrorists following credible intelligence.

The soldiers engaged the hoodlums in a shootout in the Abasiya-Amale area of Polewire in Kachia council of the state, Aruwan said, quoting a military report.

He said: "In the fierce battle, the troops overpowered the bandits and subsequently destroyed their hideouts. The following items were also recovered: One AK47 rifle, two magazines carrying 38 rounds of ammunition and one cell phone."

Troops of Operation Hadin Kai (OPHK) also reportedly eliminated 31 Boko Haram and Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWAP) terrorists and arrested 70 of them and their collaborators. Defence spokesman Major-General Musa Danmadami said yesterday that the feat was recorded in the last two weeks.

Gunmen have reportedly written to residents of Gulu in Lapai council of Niger State, warning them of another attack slated for October 30.
