16 Plateau accident victims discharged from three hospitals

SIXTEEN survivors of Saturday's truck accident in Mangu, Plateau State, have been discharged.

An update shows that 13 were discharged from Nici Dominus hospital; two from Infinity Hospital and one from Nanret clinic.

Three patients are still on admission at Nici Dominus hospital- one had undergone surgery and is reported to be in stable condition while one was referred to the Jos University Teaching Hospital (JUTH) which

continues to attend to the highest number of injured persons - it has 29 from Saturday crash and 16 from the Biscihi bus accident which was conveying persons to Shendam for the Southern Zone campaign kick-off last Tuesday.

A statement by the Director of Media and Publicity of the Atiku-Okowa/Mutfwang-Piyo Campaign Council, Yiljab Ab-

raham, said surgeries have continued to be performed on those seriously injured, while the rest are stable and recovering well.

At the Mangu Cottage hospital, many families have continued to claim bodies of their loved ones for burial.

Namadi Sambo, former Kwara State Governor Bukola Saraki and many campaign council officials also visited Jos to share in the grief.

According to him, 14 vehicles were affected, involving 54 persons - two females died and the others sustained injuries.
