

# Native doctor 'kills' servant over roasted meat

A native doctor known as Nze Law from Amandugba community in Isu Local Government Area of [Imo State](#) has allegedly killed his servant for eating a piece of meat belonging to him.

It was gathered that the incident happened on Sunday at Amankwo village, Alaenyi Ogwa in Mbaitoli Local Government Area of the state.

The native doctor was said to have joined hands with others to beat the deceased to death before he buried the yet-to-be identified servant in a

nearby bush without the knowledge of his (deceased's) family.

The development sparked protest in the area as youths from the Amandugba village besieged the home of the native doctor to avenge the death of the servant but met his absence.

He was said to have fled before the angry youths arrived at his residence.

Attempt by the mob to destroy his exotic mansion was said to have been scuttled by policemen deployed to forestall further breakdown of law and order.

A source in the village said: "The deceased was subjected to general beating by the native doctor and his domestic servants because he ate a piece of roasted meat without the consent of his principal.

"As a result, they beat him up until he died and was buried in a nearby bush without even contacting his family.

"So, when the information got to his people in Amandugba, a neighbouring community to Ogwa, the youths felt bad, mobilised themselves and stormed the home of the native doctor at Amankwo to avenge his death.
