NIS intensifies efforts to apprehend killers of personnel

The Nigerian Immigration Service (NIS) has vowed to arrest and bring to justice, the killers of its personnel on the Sokoto-Illela Road.

Gunmen suspected to be bandits killed two NIS officers and injured others at the Mamman Suka checkpoint on Sokoto-Illela road, a fortnight ago.

The Acting Comptroller of the service, Urola Caroline Adefoji, who made the vow in Sokoto during a condolence visit to Governor Ahmed Aliyu, said: "The agency is all out to pursue and capture the killers of personnel along Sokoto-Illela road to face justice. We will pursue them wherever they may be to pay the supreme price of their actions," she insisted.
