Assassins murder 58-year-old mother in Gombe

Afifty-eight-year-old woman, Mrs. Aishatu Abdulahi, was yesterday murdered by suspected assassins who stormed her residence at Jekadafari part of Gombe around 9 pm.

The state's Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), ASP Mahid Mua'zu, who confirmed the incident in a statement, said the perpetrators stormed Mrs. Abdullahi's residence at Jekadafari Quarters in Gombe at about 21:45hrs and gruesomely slaughtered her before fleeing with her cell phone.

Mua'zu said the Commissioner of Police in charge of the Operations Department, Gombe State Command, CP Hayatu Usman, on behalf of the Commissioner of Police Gombe State Command, has ordered the Assistant Commissioner of Police Criminal Investigation Department to personally investigate the murder of Aishatu Abdullahi.

"On receipt of the information, police operatives moved to the scene where Mrs. Abdullahi was found in a pool of blood and was immediately rushed to the Specialist Hospital where she was sadly pronounced dead.

"The Gombe State Police Command has expressed shock and dismay at the heinous crime and has pledged to do everything in its power to bring the perpetrators to justice. The Command has launched a full-scale investigation to ascertain the circumstances surrounding the incident and identify those responsible for the brutal murder," he said.

"The Command extends its heartfelt condolences to the family of Aishatu Abdullahi and we want to assure the public that we are doing everything possible to apprehend the perpetrators of this heinous crime and bring them to justice.

"We urge anyone with information that could lead us in our investigation to come forward and give us the information."

The Command urged residents to remain calm, vigilant and report any suspicious activities or individuals to the Police.

Mua'zu also encouraged members of the public to cooperate fully with the police as they carry out their investigation, saying without the support they might not get to the roots of the problems because some of the criminals are from within the community being terrorized.

"We are committed to maintaining law and order in the state and will not rest until those responsible for this senseless act of violence are brought to justice.

"The Command wishes to remind the general public that the movement restriction earlier imposed is still in place and also the Okada and Keke Napep riders are encouraged to help the police with information," he said.

Meanwhile, Gombe State Governor Muhammadu Inuwa Yahaya has condemned the gruesome murder of Mrs. Aishatu Abdulahi and directed security operatives to track down the culprits.

Yahaya, in a statement signed by his Director General, Press Affairs, Malam Ismaila Uba Misilli, described the incident as a mindless act.

The governor directed the police and other relevant security agencies in the state to mobilise investigative assets and ensure that the perpetrators of the heinous crime are brought to justice.

He vowed that Gombe State, under his watch, will continue to maintain steadfast commitment to ensuring the safety and security of all its citizens.

"We have zero-tolerance policy towards criminal activities, and this incident only strengthens our resolve to uphold the peace and security that our state is known for.

"I want to make it abundantly clear that there will be no escape from justice for those responsible for this vile and vicious act.

"Our security agencies are directed to leave no stone unturned to track down the culprits to account for their heinous act."
