Giving details of the Jebba Road accident yesterday, FRSC's spokesman, Corps Commander Olusegun Ogungbemide, said two vehicles, a blue Iveco trailer with no registration and a white Truyota registration and a white Toyota Hiace bus with registration number LSD363YE were involved

Preliminary investigation suggested excessive speed and wrongful overtaking as causes of the accident, the FRSC spokesman said.

He said: "A total of 25 people were involved, comprising 13 male adults, five female adults, two female children and five male children.

"From this number, five peo-ple were injured (three male adults and two female adults), and 19 victims killed (11 male adults, three female adults, three male children and two

female children.

"The injured victims have been rescued to Orisun Ayo Hospital. One corpse was deposited at the morgue of the same hospital while the remaining 18 dead bodies were claimed by the families of the deceased."

He quoted FRSC Corps Marshal, Shehu Mohammed, as expressing "displeasure over the alarming rate of recklessness of drivers who have continued to continued to continued to the content of the tinued to contravene established traffic regulations and causing undue harm to lives and unprecedented destruction to properties"

"In line with his 2024 agenda for drastic reduction in road carnages, the Corps Marshal has directed Commanding Officers to intensify special patrol operations against these identified violations," he added.

15 people injured in Lagos multiple accident - LASEMA A separate motor accident in Lagos yesterday left about 15 passengers injured, according to the State Emergency Man-agement Agency (LASEMA) Permanent Secretary, Dr Olufemi Oke-Osanyintolu.

The multiple accident oc-curred at Ketu, inward Ojota. He said the accident in-volved a BRT bus with registra-tion number EXY-167XY, an articulated truck with unknown registration number and an 18-seater commercial bus with registration number JJJ-439YG.

The articulated truck was laden with a 40-feet container.
He said: "Further investiga-

tions revealed that the articulated truck, while heading inward Ketu, suddenly lost con-trol on motion."

The truck reportedly skid-ded off its lane and collided with the BRT bus headed inward Ojota from the opposite

The BRT subsequently skidded off its lane into the service lane and collided with the yel-

To minimise mishaps on the roads during the festivities, the organisation said vesterday that it would be deploying 184 personnel, 743 patrol vehicles, 184 administrative vehicles, 92 ambulances, 23 tow trucks and 144 motorbikes as parts of logistics for the special operations.

Also being deployed are tyre pressure gauges, extricating machines and digital

breathalyzers.
Corps Marshal Mohammed corps Marshal Mohammed told reporters in Abuja that the special operation was designed to reduce road traffic crashes, fatalities, injuries, provide prompt response to road traffic crash victims and speedy re-moval of obstructions from the moval of obstructions from the highways, among others. He added that 15 traffic con-

trol camps were dedicated solely to identifying traffic grid-lock areas to be manned by FRSC personnel on 24-hour

basis.

His words: "In achieving the objectives of the special operations, the corps will combine the engagement of the motoring public through purposeful and impactful public education programmes, strengthening of programmes, strengthening of surveillance activities to reguprogrammes, sterightering or surveillance activities to regu-late unprofessional excesses, sustained effective patrol oper-ations as well as adequate moni-toring on the highways."

Over 200 mobile courts are also being provided to check road traffic offences.

He said beyond the Eid-el-Kabir celebration, the corps would deploy more technology that would reduce the interface between drivers and FRSC presonnel FRSC personnel.
