## 2 die, 100 houses destroyed by rain in Birnin Kebbi

O fewer than two people lost their lives and a hundred houses were destroyed in Birnin Kebbi, the capital of Kebbi State as a result of heavy down fall.

The rain which started around 12 midnight of Monday did not stop until 7 am of Tuesday.

The affected areas according to our investigations were Yar-yara, tsohon Gari, Tudu Wada, Jafin-Atiku, Badamiya and Shiyar Zabarmawa all in Birnin Kebbi metropolis.

According to findings, most of the people living in the areas affected, are now homeless as their houses were destroyed by the rainfall.

Also social amenities such as telephones lines cables, internet webs and electricity poles were also destroyed by the downfall.

Weekly contacted the only Internet café along Waziri Umaru Polytechnic Birnin Kebbi where a lot of people browse and send messages through the net besieged customers to the premises but the owners told them there was "no way to send messages as the downfall had destroyed their website equipment."

Already the state government had released assorted grains which will be given to the affected victims.
