## FIRE KILLS 4 IN AKOKO

ONDO State Governor Olusegun Agagu has condoled victims of a night fire that claimed four lives and razed houses, shops, vehicles and property worth millions of naira in the Owaro Oka in the Akoko area of the state.

Agagu described the fire incident caused by fuel spillage from a tanker that fell down in the heart of the community asa disaster and great calamity. However, he said the state government had already commenced processes of providing relief to the victims.

The governor, who was represented by his deputy, Otunba Omolade Óluwateru. during a visit to the scene, said the local government authorities had been mandated to get the estimate of the number of persons, houses and property involved with a view to alleviating the impact on the people.

"We commiserate with the people of this community on this sad development. We are deeply touched especially that lives, which are irreplaceable. are involved. The Agagu-led government, in its characteristic manner of responsiveness and commitment to the welfare of the people-has started thinking of ways out of this and how to assist the victims

within the next one week." he said.

He assured the community that the Federal Government and necessary agencies would be involved in the process with a view to providing an alternative route for heavy-duty trucks which had dents in the community. Head of the community and the Asin of Okaland, Oba Lawrence Omorinbola, who thanked the governor for immediate response and humane posture, appealed for speedy assistance to the victims, adding that something must be done to bar trucks

from plying the road.

## Kaduna FRSC preaches road safety during Christmas

KADUNA zone of the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) has again warned motorists on the danger in non-observance of road traffic regulations.

The zonal commanding officer in-charge of Kaduna zonal Commander Assistant Corp Marshal Wubang Khinma Lepzem who gave the warning at a press briefing said his commission was poised to ensure accident free Christmas, Sallah and new year celebrations.

To this end, Lepzem said special Marshals from the zone will be on duty in all the highways for 24 hours through out all the festivals.

He reminded commercial driv-

ers to make sure that they strictly adhere to all traffic laws to avoid being arrested by his men.

Lepzem added that his officials have been instructed to apprehend any drivers that refuses to obey traffic laws especially during the up among festivities.

He identified many factors that always lead to fatal accident to include over speeding, dangerous driving, drunkenness, over loading, night journeys, using of mobile phone while driving, lack of use of seat belt and over taking among others.

The zonal commanding officer of FRSC also spoke on the dangers in allowing under aged kids to drive on the highways by their

parents, saying that his men would arrest any under aged driver while the vehicle would be impounded.

Lepzem therefore appealed to wealthy parents not to allow their under aged kids to drive on the highways.

He also announced that the commission is equipped with tools with which to work like ambulance and patrol motorcycles to enable them take part effectively in rescue mission in case of accident.

The zonal commanding officer appealed for cooperation from both the road users, commercial drivers, NURTW and NARTO officials to ensure that these periods of festivities were marked without accident on the roads.
