2 KILLED IN SHOOT OUT IN YENAGOA

saw the corpses of the two men.

An eye-witness said the victims were killed by stray bullets during a shoot out between the militants and a combined team of soldiers and police at about 6 p.m. on Friday.

The State Ministry of Public Utility, Water Board, Parklane Hotel, De' Giant Supermarket and Obaino Electrical all at the Ovom suburb of the state capital were badly damaged with explosives suspected to be dynamite.

The roofs, windows, doors

and walls of the affected buildings were brought down by the impact.

Unconfirmed report have it that the militants came to release 30 of their members that were arrested at Ekirimo headquarters of Ekirimo Local Gov-

ernment Area.

The militants were detained at the 'A' division police station and their colleagues succeeded in effecting their release.

However, the PPRO, Mr Ebork Ette Iniobong, told NAN

that the police 'A' division was calm and could not confirm if any of the youths in Ekirimo were arrested.

Meanwhile, Governor Goodluck Jonathan of Bayelsa in a broadcast earlier in the day had confirmed that the shoot

out lasted for more than two hours.

He said that government was aware of the sponsors and there were meetings in Lagos and Abuja in preparation for the invasion on Friday.

Jonathan said that the attack would not in anyway affect election in the state.

Security in the state has been beefed up with soldiers stationed at strategic locations around the state capital to forestall another violence.
