Sources stressed that before the arrival of police detectives into the bush path, the dead body of the factional. NURTW Chairman was reported moved to an unknown destination with the security operatives said to be looking for the dead body as at the time of sending this report.

New Nigerian reliably gathered that following the kidnap and the killing of the NURTW

factional Chairman by yet to be identified gunmen, security operatives have stormed Ogbomoso to unravelled the mystery surrounding the kidnap and the subsequent killing of the factional NURTW Chairman.

Reliable police source said as at the time of sending this report, men of the Oyo State Police Command are still arresting people suspected of having any connection with the kidnap and the killing of the factional NURTW Chairman within and outside Ogbomoso.

Speaking with the New Nigerian, Oyo State Police Pub-

lic Relations Officer, ASP Olu Akinmoladun confirmed the story, saying, "we have made a lot of arrest over the matter", and that investigations still continue on the case.
