GUNMEN KILL DPO IN ILESA

TRAGEDY struck weekend in Ilesa, when a Divisional Police Officer (DPO) was killed by unknown gunmen.

The police officer, attached to Ijamo police station in Ilesa East Local Government Area of Osun, was identified as Tajudeen Salawu.

The News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) learnt that the DPO, who was leading a patrol team, was ambushed by the assailants who opened fire on patrol team in the early hours of Saturday.

According to the report, members of the patrol team

engaged the assailants in a gun battle for some minutes before the DPO was reportedly hit by a bullet.

The patrol team, however, succeeded in killing one of the assailants before they fled.

The Police spokesman, Mr

Joshua Olayemi, confirmed the shooting and said that 20 suspects, including some members of the community's vigilante group, had been arrested.

The body of the slain DPO has been deposited at the state General Hospital in Ilesa, while

those that sustained gunshot injuries are receiving treatment at an undisclosed hospital.

The state Police Commissioner, Mr John Moronike, who also visited the scene of the incident, condemned the action of the hoodlums.
