From Front Page Col 4 Ipm when one of the mothers went into the garage where the father's car was parked to take some foodstuff when she perceived nasty odour ,which she traced to the car which was locked and covered with car jacket.

On removing the jacket, she saw the bodies but they were at advanced stage of decomposition that she could not even recognize what they were.

She called her elder daughter who also could not recognize what she had seen, a neighbour who was called confirmed recognizing them as their missing children.

According to the witness, the bodies of the two brothers were deposited at the Specialist Hospital, Sokoto.

When New Nigerian contacted the Police Public Relation Officer, he requested for a short time to confirm from the DPO nearest to the area, the confirmation that was yet to be received as at the time of filing this report.
