recklessly and causing the causing the death of a 2-year-old boy, the police in Lagos charged Waheed Oke, 22, before a somolu Magistrates Court.

The accused is facing an eight-count charge of reckless driving and driving without valid drivers' licence, among others.

Oke, however, pleaded not guilty to the charges levelled against him.

The prosecutor, ASP. Akinlabe Adegoke told the court that the defendant drove his Bedford Lorry recklessly and caused the death of one Moruf Toyeeb.

According to the prosecutor, Oke was driving on the public highway

without a drivers' licence, no certificate of road worthiness and worn-out tyres.

"Oke parked on the highway for repairs without using a triangular reflector and his conduct allegedly caused a child to die," he said.

Adegoke said that the offences were committed on Oct. 26, along Olatunji St., Bariga, Lagos.

The offences, according to Adegoke, contravened Sections 7, 17, 25, 27 and 36 of the Criminal Code, as well as the traffic laws of Lagos State.

The Senior Magistrate, Mrs Bola Osunsanmi, admitted the accused to bail in the sum of 50, 000 Naira with two sureties in like sum.

The case was adjourned till Nov.7 for trial.
