MEN of the Katsina State Police Command have killed one of the suspected armed robbers who attacked a Bank in Batsari local government area of the state.

The Police killed the robber during an exchange of fire at a Nahuta village situated at a boarder area between Jibia and the neighbouring Zamfara State.

The state commissioner of Police Alhaji Ibrahim Mohammed who confirmed the killing when inspecting the dead body of the robber said Police had also recovered all money stolen by robbers, two A.K. 47 guns and two "KSEA" brand of motorcycles used during the operation as well as some boundless of Bank tellers and cheaque books.

Alhaji Ibrahim Mohammed said the team of policemen headed by the Area Commander in-charge of Katsina Central along with the Divisional Police Officer of Batsari local government CSP

Sylvester Edogbanya pursuit the robbers soon after reporting on the incidence which occurred at about 12:45pm on Tuesday.

He however said the robber

had killed a customer in the bank and wounded eleven others while attempting to run away after the operation.

The Police Commissioner

said all victims of the robbery were immediately been taken to Katsina General Hospital for timely treatment.

Ibrahim Mohammed who lauded the effort of the Police

for reaching the robbers enjoined members of the general public not to hesitate in reporting to the Police any suspicious acts for prompt action. Investigations show that the recovered money stolen by the robbers were meant for the payment of salaries of workers in Batsari local government.

N3.4trn OIL SUBSIDY WENT INTO WRONG HANDS
