Ajah crisis murder: Court orders remand of NURTW worker

A Lagos Magistrate Court sitting in Ikeja has ordered the remand of a 25-year old worker of the National Union of Road Transport Workers (NURTW), Monday Ikudenyibo, in prison custody over allegation of murder of five people during the Ajah crisis two months ago.

The remand order was given pending the legal advice of the Director of Public Prosecution in the state.

Ikudenyibo, who was arraigned before Magistrate Abiodun Akinde (Miss) is facing a 10-count charge of conspiracy, murder and attempted murder, preferred against him by the police.

The police prosecutor, Inspector Benson Emuerhi, told the court that the accused and others at large committed the alleged crime on May 25 at about 8.00 a.m. at Ajah Round About.

He said that Ikudenyibo unlawfully murdered one Shola Hausa by shooting him with a gun.

Emuerih also claimed that the defendant murdered one Isiaka Promise by shooting him with a gun, which led to his death.

He added that while armed with a gun, he also murdered one Idowu Olumegbon by shooting him.

The prosecutor said that the suspect and others still at large unlawfully murdered one Bola Akeju, by

shooting him with a gun.

He further added that Ikudenyibo, on the same date, time and place, murdered one Hammed Alex by shooting him with a gun.

The prosecutor further told the court that the defendant, on June 26, at about 9:30p.m, at Lakowe Ibeju, Lekki area of Lagos, attempted to kill one Lateef Aluko by shooting him on the chest, with a gun.

He said that the accused also attempted to kill one Ibrahim by shooting him on his left leg with the agun.

Emuerih also claimed that the defendant unlawfully inflicted wounds on Lateef Aluko's chest and wounds on Ibrahim's left leg by shooting them with a gun.
