The News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) learnt that the hoodlums had attacked the residence of a business tycoon, Alhaji Yawale Gandi at around 3.00am on Sunday, where the boy was killed.

The suspects, who were said to have carted away undisclosed amount of money, also injured a 20-year-old man, who was treated and discharged from the Gandi Primary Health Centre.

"I will not comment on this incident, but I will only thank God," he stated.

The spokesman of the state police command, DSP Al-Mustapha Sani, confirmed the incident on Monday, saying investigations had since commenced.

"We are suspecting that the hoodlums came from neighbouring Zamfara State, so, we are collaborating with Zamfara police command to trail them with a view to arresting them," Sani added.
