A Suspected cultists kill 1 in Benue

6 students arrested over cultism in Osun

SUSPECTED cult members, on Tuesday, unleashed terror on Kansho area of Makurdi, the Benue State capital, leading to the death of a middle aged man.

The suspected cultists, according to eyewitnesses,

stormed Kansho area in a commando style, making residents to scamper for safety but not without leaving a casualty behind after their operation.

Confirming the incident, the Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Daniel Ezeala, said the command had commenced investigation

into the killing of the man by the suspected cultists.

He told the *Nigerian Tribune* in a telephone interview that the yet-to-be identified man died on his way to the hospital at about 10p.m., adding that nine persons have been arrested in connection with the incident.

He said while investigation

had commenced, residents of Makurdi and other towns should report suspicious movements to the police.

On the Agatu crisis which claimed 15 lives last Sunday, Ezeala said normalcy has returned to the affected area, Ogwule-Ankpa. He said more policemen have been deployed in the area to forestall further breakdown of law and order.
