## Gunmen kill motorcycle rider in Osun

GUNMEN, in the early hours of Thursday, in Ilesa, Osun State, killed a commercial motocyclist identified as Segun Adekanmi.

The deceased, according to sources around Isokun and Oke Omiru where the incident occurred, informed Saturday Tribune that Adekanmi was killed while working with his motorcycle around Oke Omiru, Isokun neighbourhood.

Though there were no clear details on how the late Adekanmi was killed, some of his colleagues, who spoke under condition of anonymity, said those that carried out the act must have been motorcycle snatchers.

Credible sources told Saturday Tribune at the commercial motorcycle unit where the deceased worked that his motorcycle was carted away after he was killed by the assailants.

A relation of late Adekanmi said that the deceased was married with a kid and until the incident occurred, his main occupation had been commercial motorcycling.

While commenting on the incident, members of Oke Omiru unit, Ilesa of Okada Riders' Association tasked the police to investigate the matter and bring the perpetrators to book.

When contacted, Public Relations Officer of Osun State police command, Folasade Odoro, said she was yet to be briefed on the incident.
