Ex-soldier kills own son

Police begin manhunt

THE Ondo State police command has begun a manhunt for an ex-soldier, Dasilver Adedipe, who allegedly killed his son in Akure on Monday.

Adedipe was alleged to have killed the 24 year-old man, Ayo Adedipe, following argument between the two on NEPA bill brought to their residence in Maronu area of Araromi area, Akure.

It was gathered that the duo engaged in altercation over the mode of payment of the debt on the bill fol-

lowing which the suspect allegedly drew a gun and shot his son.

The incident, which was said to have happened at about 9a.m., led to pandemonium in the community as Ayo was said to have started bleeding immediately he was hit by the bullet.

Eyewitnesses added that the father later took the corpse of his son away from the scene to Onigari village, Irese, Akure.

Confirming the development, the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Ondo State command, Wole Ogodo, said the wife

of the deceased, Olaide Adedipe, reported the case to the police.

According to him, following the complaint lodged by the woman, men of the detectives department of the command proceeded to Onigari village where the deceased's corpse was found.

He said the corpse was removed to the mortuary of the state specialist hospital for autopsy.

He added that the scene of the incident was visited, while preliminary investigation and efforts were on to arrest the fleeing culprit.
