Two persons, including a popular hotelier in Badia area of Lagos State, were, on Saturday night, feared killed, allegedly by the policemen, as two rival factions of hoodlums clashed at Railway Area of liora Badia.

One other person, identified as Baba, was earlier injured by suspected members of Badia Boys, who engaged their counterparts from Railway Line.

The policemen were trying to restore normalcy when bullets allegedly fired by the police hit the hotelier, indentified as Chicco and one other person.

A resident of the area, who identified himself as Adeola, narrated that "one hotelier, identified as Omojuwa, was celebrating the fourth remembrance of his late father when the incident happened."

Adeola added that "in the process, there was a clash over territorial control between boys from Badia and Railway Boys, prompting the invitation of policemen."

It was gathered that the police, on arriving at the scene of the clash, shot sporadically into different directions and in the process, hit Chicco and one other person.

Both victims were taken to the hospital, where they were reportedly confirmed dead on Saturday night, prompting the early Sunday invasion of the police station by women, led by the mother of the slain hotelier.

About 50 angry women, led by the mother of the slain hotelier, and urchins, on Sunday morning, invaded Badia Divisional police station and threw stones and broken bottles at the station.

The policemen on duty shot sporadically into the air, preventing the angry mob from setting the police station ablaze.

Efforts to get the reaction of the image maker in charge of the state police command, Ngozi Braide, failed as calls to her mobile phone lines we not answered.
