

Kwara dep gov's ADC slumps, dies

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DIFFERENT reasons have trailed the death of Aide de Camp (ADC) to the deputy governor of Kwara State, Police Inspector Gaya Mark.

Nigerian Tribune gathered from sources close to the Government House, Ilorin, on Wednesday, that Inspector Gaya, 40, died of cardiac arrest.

A source said the deceased had an argument with a commercial motorcycle rider in Ilorin metropolis yesterday, leading to physical exchange of hands between the ADC and the *okada* man.

The source also said that the raised voice of the ADC aggravated his hypertensive health state, while he suddenly slumped during the altercation with the *okada* man and died at the scene.

However, another source close to the Government House, Ilorin, said the ADC had tried to stop an *okada* rider who was about to interrupt the convoy of the deputy governor, Elder Peter Kisira, on the Illofa Road, Ilorin, on Wednesday morning.

The source narrated that Inspector Mark was hypertensive and had for some time been suffering from heart attacks, while his attempts to maintain orderliness in the convoy of the deputy governor aggravated it yesterday morning when he slumped and died.

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
