Man dies inside P&G facility

A man identified as Madaki Ajang Dabo, on Wednesday, lost his life while carrying out repair work on one of the facilities owned by Procter and Gamble Nigeria Limited, Oluyole Industrial Estate, Ibadan.

When the Nigerian Tribune, on Thursday morning visited the company's premises, the Manager, External Relations, Abdul-Fattah Olanlege said that the company would come up with an official statement by noon same day.

A statement issued by Procter & Gamble noted that: "On January 22nd, 2014, an employee of

Consolidated Engineering Services (CES) named Madaki Ajang Dabo, had a fatal accident while carrying out repair work on a lift installed by CES for our facility. The unfortunate accident which occurred at about 7:45p.m. led to his immediate demise."

The statement further read: "We are aware that the representative of Consolidated Engineering Services (CES) notified the relevant authorities and have already contacted the family of the deceased. CES is committed to manage all the necessary arrangements to resolve necessary reports -que bueventinontus and support the family.

"We deeply sympathise with the family of the deceased and the employee of Consolidated Engineering Services (CES) on the loss. CES is one of our reliable contractor companies, which provides and supports equipment installations as well as follow up engineering technical support for P&G installations."
