OOU medical students protest against 'illegal school fees'

HUNDREDS of students of the medical school of the Olabisi Onabanjo University (OOU), Ago-Iwoye, Ogun State, have protested against the decision of the institution's management, asking them to pay what they described as 'illegal school fees.'

The students, on Tuesday, stormed the premises of the State Assembly Complex, Oke-Mosan, Abeokuta, alleging that the school vice-chancellor, Professor Sabur Adesanya, had ordered them to pay extra two years school fees.

The students armed with placards with inscriptions such as, "Injustice is cruel and it breeds anger". "We will not pay illegal school fees", "Stop this unnecessary student extortion."

The students appealed to the lawmakers to come to their aid and address the problem.

The Speaker, Honourable Suraj Adekunbi urged the students to remain calm while assuring them that the issue would receive utmost attention.
