Police arrest clergyman for hacking wife to death

clergyman has been arrested in Ogwash-uku, Delta State, for hacking his wife to death with an object suspected to be a hammer.

The 54-year-old man whose name was given as Michael Andrew Chuk-wuekmeke, was said to have attacked his wife, 40-year-old Ifeoma Rosemar, a primary school teacher while she was asleep, on Tuesday night

and thereafter escaped, in order to avert police arrest.

On arrest, he however, told the police that armed robbers struck at their house on the fateful night and killed his wife, while he escaped, but police investigation revealed that no robbery took place.

The clergyman was said not to have been in good as the authorities of the local church where they both worship, had tried on several occasions to settle them, but without success.

The incident which took place at Umudei quarters in the town, left residents wondering why the pastor committed the dastard act.

Thursday, the State Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Celestine Kalu said investigation into the matter was in progress.
