

# UNILORIN faculty loses student, lecturer

The Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin (UNILORIN) will, for a long time, remember with heavy hearts the loss of a lecturer, Dr Maureen Ogwokhademhe, of the Department of Counselling Education, who died at the age of 41 from an ailment.

Recently, the faculty also lost a female undergraduate who died from an accident that occurred on the university campus.

It was reported that she was the only one that died, while others that were involved in the accident sustained serious injuries.

It was because of the losses that the students of the faculty decided, last week, to give them a farewell ceremony by organising a rally around the different faculties of the university, dressed in black clothes.

Alongside the students were the faculty president and the president of the Department of Guidance and Counselling, who described the late lecturer as amiable and a very diligent lecturer.

"She was indeed a great lecturer and she will forever be indelible in the department and the faculty at large," said one of the students.

Tears flowed freely from many of the students when the president of the department read a farewell message in honour of the two deceased.

The students also prayed for the deceased, asking that such would never happen again in the faculty.
