Police kill 2 car snatchers, arrest 4 others in Delta

NEMESIS had caught up with six car snatchers, two in Ekpan, near Warri and four, who committed crime at Ekpan, in Kaduna.

The two suspects were killed in a gun duel with the police on June 2 at about 9.30 p.m, after snatching a car from one Adamu Habu of NNPC Housing Complex, Ekpan.

The car, a Volkswagen
Passat 2006 model, with
registration number JL 781
EKY, was snatched at gunpoint by a gang of four.

While two unidentified suspects met their death, the other two escaped with bullet wounds after abandoning a Toyota Camry with registration number BB 294 USL.

The six suspects were paraded at Ekpan Police Station, Ekpan, Uvwie Local Government Area of the state on Wednesday, by the acting Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), DSP Charles Muka, who said the four other car snatchers were nabbed alive in Kaduna.

Messr Christopher Ode (23), Oke Ese (23), Kola Daudu (22), Tope Ajayi and two others, now at large, confessed that they snatched a Toyota Highlander SUV, with registration number KJA 696 CD valued at N2.8 million from one Bernice Egodo of PBS Edjeba, off Ekpan.

Kola Daudu, a motor mechanic, who said he lost his workshop to the recent demolition of illegal structures in Warri, confessed to the crime on behalf of his colleagues.

When asked what they used in carrying out their operation, he said "we use

cut-to size made gun to collect the car from Ekpan. I be motor mechanic and this na my first operation."

DSP Muka said while investigation was going on to arrest other members of the gang, arrested suspects would face the music.

He warned members of the public to be wary of purchasing cars that were ridulously cheap, saying such could be a stolen car.
