authoritatively Metro gathered that the accident, which occurred in the early hours of Thursday, threw the area into confusion as sympathisers thronged the scene to catch a glimpse of the mangled body of Se-

The driver of the tanker was said to be driving against the traffic following the rehabilitation works being carried out on Gbongan-Ibadan expressway at Owode-Ede area, which made the construction workers to divert traffic to one lane of the road.

Eyewitness informed Metro that Segun, who just left a food canteen after eating, attempted to cross the road to the other side when the truck crushed

According to another eyewitness, identified as Kunle Adebare, "the accident was terrible and shocking and I couldn't even stand the gory sight of the victim. The driver of the trailer should be blamed because he was speeding while plying the

"Segun was coming from cafeteria where he went to eat and when he tried to cross the road; unknowingly to him that vehicles going to Osogbo had been diverted to the road. Aft the truck crushed him, t driver failed to stop, havi realised what had happened He drove on but some pe ple pursued him."

Angry youths joined ot ers to pursue the tank driver, while some oth people set bonfire on t two lanes of the expressw to protest Segun's killing The driver was report not to have stopped ur he got to Zone Eleven the Nigeria Police, who he took refuge to avoid h ing lynched," Adebare marked.

However, one of t youths who ran after t driver told Metro th "when we got to to the zon office, the police brutalis us and seized our motor

The intervention of so security personnel and t ditional ruler of Owo Ede, Oba Oyedepo Nur calmed the aggriev youths.

Oba Oyedepo, thereaft called on the Osun St government to erect spe breakers at Owode due market days and influx people, in order to prev reoccurrence of such ir dent.
