Public Relations Officer of the university, Ahmed Tanko, told the Nigerian Tribune that luck ran out of the fellow, when the security stopped him at about 11.00 p.m. on Sunday.

He said he was not sure about suicide bomber's gender, as of the time of writing this report, but added that calm had been restored to the university community.

The Borno State Police Command on Monday confirmed the death of two suspected suicide bombers after another foiled attack in Maiduguri.

Mr Victor Isuku, the spokesman of the command, disclosed this in a statement in Maiduguri.
